As we continue to study the adult guardianship system in Missouri, we find the need to request additional records from the judicial branch. We appreciate your cooperation.

We noticed that the judicial branch has training requirements for guardians ad litem as well as for court personnel in juvenile justice proceedings. We are wondering what training or educational requirements may exist for judges, guardians, court appointed counsel, or others who participate in adult guardianship proceedings.

- 5. Training or educational requirements for court-appointed attorneys regarding their responsibilities under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 6. Materials or programs provided to such attorneys pertaining to #4 or #5 above in the past five years.
- 7. Training or educational requirements for guardians regarding their role in adult guardianship proceedings.
- 8. Training or educational requirements for guardians regarding their responsibilities under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 9. Materials or programs provided to such guardians pertaining to #4 or #5 above in the past five years.
